

NINR Biennial Report for FY 2013 and FY 2014 on the Inclusion of Women and Minorities in Clinical Research Studies

Presented to the National Advisory Council for Nursing Research at the January 2015 Council

The National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR) as a component of the National Institutes of Health is mandated by the U.S. Congress under the NIH Revitalization Act of 1993, Public Law 103-43, Section 492B (2) (f) to report on the inclusion of women and minorities in clinical research studies every two years. This report complies with this requirement and reflects inclusion data for FY 2013 and FY 2014 as mandated by this law.

This act further requires that each clinical research trial be designed and carried out in a manner sufficient to provide for valid analysis of variables that may affect women or minority groups. Since interventions or therapies may affect women and/or men or members of minority groups and their subpopulations differently, it is, therefore, recognized that scientific evidence can be very important in leading to a change in health policy or standard of care. The NINR, consequently, pursues scientific evidence for these purposes and complies with NIH guidelines and other requirements of this law.

I. Background/Overview

The mission of the National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR) is to promote and improve the health of individuals, families, communities, and populations. NINR supports clinical, basic, and translational research to build the scientific foundation for clinical practice, prevent disease and disability, manage and eliminate symptoms caused by illness, enhance palliative and end-of-life care, and train the next generation of scientists.

Scientific focus areas to implement NINR's Strategic Plan include Symptom Science, Wellness, Self-Management, and End-of-Life and Palliative Care. NINR also supports the development of innovative strategies and new technologies and is investing in training strategies and programs that support ongoing development of investigators at all career stages, including those from underrepresented communities. These areas of science help to inform health policy, disseminate best practices, and promote innovation in all areas of nursing science. NINR's Strategic Plan seeks to harness the strengths of nursing science to power an ambitious research agenda that will meet current and future health care needs and anticipate future health challenges and priorities.

II. Strategies for Ensuring Compliance

NINR Scientific Review Officers use Inclusion Reviewer Guidelines to instruct reviewers to focus on the scientific acceptability of the inclusion plans (i.e., whether the proposed composition of the sample(s) is scientifically appropriate and/or justified),

while preparing critiques. The acceptability is specifically addressed during review meeting discussions. The NIH Peer Review regulations (42 C.F.R. 52h) specify that reviewers will take into account the overall impact that the project in the application could have on the research field involved, the adequacy of plans to include both sexes/genders, minorities, children, and special populations as appropriate for the scientific goals of the research. Therefore, the reviewers must factor their evaluation of the proposed plans for the inclusion of individuals on the basis of their sex/gender, race, ethnicity, and age into their overall evaluation of an application's scientific and technical merit. The goal of the inclusion policies is to ensure that the appropriate individuals (per sex/gender, race, ethnicity, and age) are included in the study or studies. This is considered in the context of the scientific goals of the application and the information describing and justifying the proposed sample(s).

Tables A and B, generated by an NIH inclusion reporting system, show NINR information on grants that peer review has considered, with two tables presented for the two fiscal years, FY 2013 and FY 2014. Therefore, there are two presentations of Table A, Level of Compliance with Inclusion Policy in New Extramural Grant Applications as Assessed During Scientific Peer Review, and two for Table B, Extramural Research Awards: Bars-to-Funding and Resolutions, for each category. The first Table A, for FY 2013, shows that a majority of applications with human subjects were compliant with the inclusion policy. The applications with unacceptable inclusion policies were in the 0-5% range. Councils for FY 2014 include four of the eight columns shown (Oct-12, Jan-13, May-13, and Aug-13). The second Table A, for FY 2014, also shows that a majority of applications with human subjects were compliant with the inclusion policy. The applications with unacceptable inclusion policies were in the 0-6% range for FY 2014. Councils for FY 2014 include, also, only four of the eight columns shown (Oct-13, Jan-14, May-14, and Aug-14). Likewise, for both Table Bs, all inclusion bars-to-funding for applications were removed by Program staff, 6-8% versus 7-13%, respectively, for FY 2013 and FY 2014.

In regards to training all relevant program, grants management and review personnel receive training in gender and minority inclusion and tracking policies as provided by NIH. Therefore, all NINR staff involved in inclusion reporting are appropriately trained to monitor and document tracking and inclusion compliance.

III. Analysis and Interpretation of Data (required)

Tables 1, 2, 5, 6, 9 and 10, that follow Tables A and B, also generated by an NIH reporting system, provide aggregate annual data on the inclusion of women and minorities as subjects in clinical studies/research. Tables 1 and 2 relate to NINR's aggregate extramural enrollment data, Tables 5 and 6 relate to NINR's Phase III clinical studies data and Tables 9 and 10 reflect NINR's intramural research data. Note: The term "Old Form" still appears at the top of each table although no studies are reported there. This form still appears since a small number of research grants funded by NIH may continue to be submitting information using the older 1977 OMB Standard

Form for reporting demographic data rather than the 1997 OMB Standard Form, now referred to as the New Form.

Tables 1 & 2:

Table 1: FY 2013 Aggregate Enrollment Data for All Extramural Research Protocols, shows enrollment in the 137 NINR protocols for FY 2013 that totaled 22,245 participants. Table 2: FY 2014 Aggregate Enrollment Data for All Extramural Research Protocol, shows enrollment in the 129 NINR protocols for FY 2014 that totaled 50,650. Overall human subject enrollment increased significantly between FY 2013 to FY 2014. This increase in enrollment was due largely to one study aimed at reducing the number of avoidable hospitalizations among nursing home residents, with a large enrollment of 29,197 in FY 2014.

Enrollment percentages by ethnicity and race from FY 2013 to FY 2014 decreased among some ethnic and racial categories (i.e. among Hispanic and Black participants). This decrease was due to the large study that reported enrollment for the first time in FY 2014 (29,197 participants). NINR continues its commitment to include women in clinical research with 59% or more of those enrolled being female in both FY 2013 and FY 2014. A decrease in the enrollment of Hispanic females from 12% to 7% between FY 2013 and FY 2014 was accompanied by a similar drop in enrollment for Hispanic males from 11% to 7% although for both groups the actual enrollment numbers increased from 1,634 to 2,235 for Hispanic females and 1,017 to 1,136 for Hispanic males, respectively. For Black females between FY 2013 to FY 2014 the percentage dropped from 34% to 21%, although actual enrollment numbers also increased (from 4,509 to 6,987). Black males represented the same percentage of overall enrollment, approximately 28% in FY 2013 and in FY 2014, although their actual enrollment increased from 2,500 in FY 2013 to 4,581 in FY 2014.

Tables 5 & 6:

NINR has a limited number of Phase III Clinical Trials. Table 5: FY 2013 Aggregate Enrollment Data for Extramural Phase III Research Protocols shows three protocols with an enrollment of 454, while Table 6: FY 2014 Aggregate Enrollment Data for Extramural Phase III Research Protocols, shows two protocols with an enrollment of 337.

Table 9: FY 2013 Aggregate Enrollment Data for Intramural Research Protocols for On-Site and Off-Site Combined shows 16 protocols with an enrollment of 1,004, while Table 10: FY 2014 Aggregate Enrollment Data for Intramural Research Protocols for On-Site and Off-Site Combined shows 15 protocols with an enrollment of 969. Ethnicity and racial percentages for NINR's intramural studies remained approximately the same from FY 2013 to FY 2014.
